In the case of face to face meetings, please be mindful to avoid unwanted and uninvited physical contact.

If you are in any doubt about what these boundaries mean, or if you feel that they are not being respected, we encourage you to speak with a group officer and, if appropriate, to raise the issue at a conscience meeting.

As ever, we are guided in all this by a loving Higher Power, and we look to our collective conscience for wisdom.
